MIEN KLOPPERS: Philippine Kid SUPER MODEL


Grace and elegance can be flaunted even at a young age.

Filipino: a Reflection of our Identity and Culture

Who wants their child to be left behind in this highly competitive world where English seems to be the universal language? No one does. With everyday exposure to cable TV, Hollywood movies, multimedia games, and English-versed books, children do become more proficient in the English language. The downside? Speaking Filipino has taken a backseat for most. No wonder our Valiant Knights struggle with Filipino words and grammar concepts.

As a Filipino, our language is inextricably connected to who we are as people. August is considered as the month of celebrating and taking pride of our national language. Fostering a love of Filipino in your child instills with them a sense of pride and belongingness. The following are the ways on how you can encourage your children to love and speak the Filipino language (cited in the article written by Annie Garcia-Manlulo, M.A.):

1. Speak it.

The most effective way to learn a language is to hear it in actual everyday conversation. At home, ask everyone to speak to your child in Filipino. Instead of requiring your child's yaya to converse with him in English, let her use Filipino as they go through their daily routine. This will introduce your tyke to new vocabulary in a proper context.

2. Tell a tale.

Use stories as a springboard for language learning. Children love storytelling, so engage your child in fun read-aloud sessions using storybooks in Filipino. This will expose him or her not only to the language but also to the Filipino culture.

3. Sing and play along.

It has been proven that learning ensues during fun and enjoyable activities. Use music and games to help your child learn to speak Filipino. Singing Pinoy songs, and using it in games will surely heighten his interest in learning our language.

4. Use technology.

Explore a variety of media resources such as video clips, software, and other online tools that help make learning the Filipino language both fun and engaging.

5. Individualize.

Find out how much or how little Filipino words he or she knows. This will help you create an age-appropriate lesson for your child.

Filipino is a beautiful language that reflects our identity and culture. We should celebrate our heritage and our history by making sure that our children know how to speak Filipino, and speak it well.
