## TONGSON BAGS PRIZE AWARD IN INT'L MATH CONTEST

**Michael Gerard R. Tongson** of Grade 4 South Korea bagged the **Prize Award** in the Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC) held last August 3, 2017.



Michael, along with 11 more students from schools such as Ateneo de Manila University, St. Jude Catholic School and Philippine Science High School, bagged the said award. The Prize Award in the Australian Mathematics Competition is a recognition given to participants whose performance is outstanding within a particular region or country within a year group.

During the competition, students are asked to solve problems designed to test their mathematical thinking. Questions are also designed so that they can be answered just as quickly without a calculator as with one. The problems get more difficult through the competition thus, students of all standards will make progress through the problems, and also be challenged along the way. Through the Guidance Office's initiative of helping students be motivated to do something good, we are re-launching the Super Manners Program for this school year!

Since we do not let our students aim for a class ticket, at least let us have them aim for something, and this is the Super Manners ticket. Since all faculty and staff have the power to issue this ticket, there are guidelines that will be followed in order to carefully assess if a student deserves a Super Manners ticket. Below are some of the good manners or behaviors that could be awarded a Super Manner ticket. However, the students should not limit their good behaviors to the following:

- ❖ Saying *Good morning* or *Good afternoon* first before saying the concern to teachers and staff
- ❖ Saying *Thank you* or showing an appreciation to a teacher/staff after helping them
- ❖ Knocking on the door of the offices/classrooms and waiting for a "come in" before entering
- ❖ Looking the teachers and staff in the eye when talking to them
- ❖ Being courteous to the staff when making a phone call
- ❖ Talking politely to the person he or she called
- ❖ Respecting the teachers and staff at all times
- ❖ Holding the door open for the person coming in, especially if he or she is carrying something
- ❖ Addressing teachers politely and by their correct names
- ❖ Coming to class prepared
- ❖ Picking up trashes or litters
- ❖ Encouraging other students to speak in English
- ❖ Preventing bullying; watching out for bullies and reporting them
- ❖ Discouraging others in saying foul words/cursing
- ❖ Putting things away and cleaning up even when not told/ reminded to do so
- ❖ Returning of lost items to the lost and found

Of course, it does not end there. At the end of the month, the student who gets the most number of tickets shall be awarded a certificate of recognition and featured in the SP Bulletin as the "Supermanner of the Month."

## PORTFOLIO MAKING HELPS STUDENTS VALUE THEMSELVES AS LEARNERS

Every end of the term, students will be given time to do their portfolio in order to chronicle their best work in school. Stonyhurst Southville International School-Malarayat will have its 1st Term Portfolio-Making on **Friday, October 13, 2017.**

A portfolio is a purposeful collection of student work that exhibits the student's efforts, progress, and achievements in one or more areas of the curriculum. It should represent a collection of students' best work or best efforts, student-selected samples of work experiences related to outcomes being assessed, and documents according to growth and development toward mastering identified outcomes. Once students see the portfolio process and a visual of their accomplishments, they develop an awareness about the work they produce.

In this new era of performance assessment related to the monitoring of students' mastery of a core curriculum, portfolios can enhance the assessment process by revealing a range of skills and understandings of the student; support instructional goals; reflect change and growth over a period of time; encourage student, teachers, and parent reflection; and provide for continuity in education from one-year to the next. It can also encourage self-directed learning, enlarging the view of what is learned, which can provide a way for students to value themselves as learners.
