EXTENDED MID - YEAR PROGRAM BRIDGES GAPS

As we finish the First Term of the school year, SSIS offers the Extended Mid- Year (EMY) on **November 6-10, 2017** to students who need intervention and assistance.

The Extended Midyear Program aims to assist students who have failed to meet the basic requirements for the First Term of the school year by bridging the gaps through intensive review and assessment during the mid year. Below are the guidelines for this undertaking:

1. A student who obtained the grade of Low Average (LA) and Poor (P) for the first term is required to attend the Mid Year classes for one whole week during the mid-year break.
2. For core subjects, there will be an intensive lecture and review everyday following the number of hours:
 Grades 1-2 1 Hour
 Grades 3-6 1 Hour
 Grades 7-10 1.5 Hours
 To assess the student's learning, a **removal exam** will be conducted on the last day. Passing grade is Average (A) is equivalent to 80%.
3. For non-core subjects, there will be a project/ undertaking assigned. A student must render one (1) hour in school for project- making. The development of the project will be strictly monitored by the subject teacher. The project will have to be finished and submitted on the day of the program.
4. A student who fails to pass the removal exam in the core subjects, and/or fails to comply with the requirements/projects for the non-core subjects will be required to attend the **Extended Year-End (EYE) Program**. If he/she would still receive a **year-end average of LA**. On the other hand, if the student obtains a **year-end average of P**, he/she will be required to attend the **Summer Classes**.
5. Students of EMY and EYE will no longer be qualified to be in the Honor's List for the Term and Year-End.

FIRST TERM PTC SLATED ON NOV 17

The Parent-Teacher conference (PTC) for the First Term is scheduled on **November 17, 2017**. The PTC is a venue where the teachers and the parents meet to discuss matters regarding the child. It is a time for the parents to share their knowledge of their child, including their hopes for the child's future. It can also be an opportunity for the teacher to increase the parents' awareness of their children's classroom experiences and how they relate with the school environment.

PTCs are at best when both teacher and parent keep in mind that the child and his/her education is the focus. Both parties have to work as a team to establish good work habits and a positive attitude toward school. This is why we strongly suggest parents' attendance. Together, let us bring the best in our children.

There will be regular classes in the morning for Grades 1-6 while preschool and high school students will not have classes on that day. **The Grades 1 and 2 students will be dismissed by 11:10 AM and Grades 3-6 is at 12:00 NN.**

The Parent-Teacher Conference for the AM session of preschool is scheduled at 8:00 AM - 12:00 NN; and 1:00 PM - 5:00 PM for the PM session. **Please take note that High School students will be given a schedule of their Student-Led Conference (SLC) which is also scheduled during the PTC.** Meanwhile, the PTC for Grades 1-6 shall begin at 1 PM.

The following guidelines are expected to be observed by all parents/guardians during Parent-Teacher Conferences (PTCs). These guidelines hope to put more order in the way conferences are done between and among parents and teachers. Everyone's cooperation is expected so that this effective tool for home-school collaboration can be maximized.

- 1. The P.T.C. shall begin at exactly 8:00 AM (for preschool AM session) until 12:00 NN; and 1:00 PM (for preschool PM session & Grades 1-6) until 5:00 PM.** It is the policy of the school not to release Report Cards before the scheduled date nor before scheduled time. Report Cards that are not claimed on the scheduled date and time will have to be claimed from the Registrar's Office.
- 2. Conferences are held in the classroom of your child and it is facilitated by your child's Homeroom Adviser.** Please make sure that you know your child's Grade Level and Section and the name of his/her Homeroom adviser before going to school.
- 3. Report cards shall be released on a "first-come-first-served" basis.** Upon arriving in school, all parents/guardians are expected to proceed to their respective classroom. This shall determine the order of conferencing with the Homeroom Adviser.
- 4. In the interest of time, each parent/guardian will be allotted a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes of conferencing with the Homeroom Adviser.** We encourage parents/guardians to keep the conference short but substantial by focusing on the most important areas that need to be discussed. Homeroom Advisers will focus the conference on your child's strengths, areas for improvement, and the formation of resolutions that will be observed to address gaps. Should there be a need for a longer time for conferencing; parents/guardians are to set for another appointment with the Homeroom Adviser on another date. Appointment forms shall be made available at the Registrar's office.
- 5. Subject Teachers and Management Officers who are not Homeroom advisers are also available for conferencing on a first-come first-served basis.** You may proceed to them after talking to or while you are waiting for your turn to have the conference with your child's Homeroom Adviser.
- 6. All report cards will only be given to parents/guardians.** Parents/guardians who will authorize other persons to collect the report card will have to submit a letter of request/authorization to the Principal subject to confirmation/approval.
- 7. The original copy of the Report Card shall only be given to parents/guardians who do not have any outstanding balance in the accounting office.** All outstanding balances have to be settled first before the original copy of the report card is given.



HS HOLDS STUDENT-LED CONFERENCES

Student-Led Conferences or SLC is when the students run the conferences, informing their parents about how they are doing, what their goals are going forward, and what kind of learners they are. SLCs are attended by the student, parent/guardian, teacher, and other adults the student would like present. The teacher facilitates the meeting, but the student is in charge. During the conference, students explain their progress toward and mastery of both academic (content/skill) and character (habits of work and learning) learning targets. Students justify their progress by leading their families through a portfolio of assignments culled from academic classes.

The objectives of the Student-Led Conference are: (1) to hone student verbal communication and critical thinking skills; and (2) to build open relationships with families concerning student progress. This year, the SLCs are scheduled on **November 17, 2017**.

The SLC Set up and The Roles of Students, Parents, and Teachers

There will be at least five simultaneous SLCs that will take place in one to two classrooms. The student is the main player of the student led conference. Teachers guide the students through the conference process and help the students prepare, but the responsibility of conveying information to parents and families rests on the students. They reflect on their progress and the areas in which they need to improve. Students share their goals and strategies to obtain these goals with the important adults in their lives.

The parent must be willing to let the student speak, saving questions until the end. The parent/guardian arrives on time. The parent/guardian shares any lingering concerns with the teacher who will inform the subject teacher. The parent/guardian helps the student meet his or her academic and behavioral goals by supporting their progress at home.

During the conference, the teacher welcomes each family, and thanks them for coming. The teacher lets the student speak but he/she may ask probing questions or direct the student to the agenda, but they do not dominate the conversation. If a parent wants to meet with a teacher, the teacher records that information and tells the subject teacher the next day.

Parent involvement can make a difference in a child's education. Effective parent involvement comes when a true partnership exists between schools and families. Creating that partnership, especially around academics, is what works for student achievement. Don't miss this opportunity to see our students and your children achieve, lead and make an amazing difference in the spirit of growth mindset!
