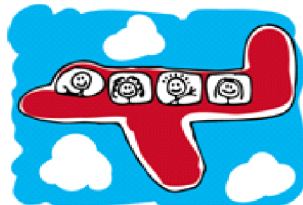

The global tour is an activity introduced by Southville International Schools and Colleges where tours in different parts of the world are offered to students and parents. This is

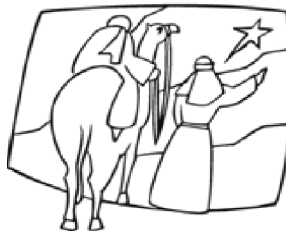
