This was the inspiring statement of Dr. Bobby Magsino, CEO of the Mary Mediatrix Medical Center, as the first session of the CEO Forum opened on August 4, 2011.

The forum is a regularly scheduled session of talks in the Business Math and Entrepreneurship subject areas where our high school students sit down and listen to top decision makers so that they will be informed and inspired to become successful business people and more importantly movers of society who will be the job providers in the future.

Dr. Bobby discussed to the students what it takes to be successful in the corporate world from a CEO's perspective. He emphasized the important characteristics and values that a CEO should develop in order to be successful in one's field and at the same time become an inspiration to others.

Likewise, the children were given updates on current business issues, how the present Philippine economic situation affects the corporate world, and how global trends have made an impact on our country.

For this particular activity, the students have been required to wear corporate attire to simulate the business world.

Organized by the Upper School Department in cooperation with the Guidance Office, the CEO Forum will feature four (4) more sessions featuring the CEOs of other companies within the school year.

Parenting Corner

Helping Hands: 16 Ways to Get Kids to Help with Household

Parents try their best to make sure that their children grow up to become responsible, obedient, and helpful. One way to teach them these values is to have them help out at home. Take note that the chores they're given don't have to be the heavier ones; tasks such as making their beds when they wake up or setting the table for meals are simple enough for school-age children to do.

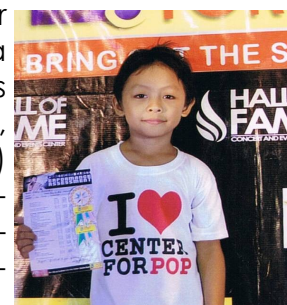
1. Start early. Teaching your kids about cleanliness at an early age makes the task more of a habit than a chore. Have your kids do simple chores as soon as they're old enough to understand instructions.
2. Be specific. The best way to teach kids how to do a chore properly is if you demonstrate it first.
3. Work with their personality. It's not difficult to get kids to help if the chore appeals to them. If your kids like being outdoors, have them help tend the garden. If they like to cook, let them help make meals.
4. Make it a habit. Making their beds or setting the table are simple chores that kids can do at home.
5. Rotate. Give every child the chance to do different chores to prevent boredom.
6. Make it fun. While your child is putting away her toys or fixing her bed, why not put on some music and sing along to the song?
7. Give points! Devise a system which awards points for chores, whether it be cleaning rooms or washing the dishes. Your kids receive a stamp for every five points, and every 20 stamps gets them a reward.
8. Provide positive reinforcement. Reward your kids when they do their chores well. A certificate that says, "You Rock!" can work just as well as money or gifts.
9. Make chore time bonding time. When you and your child do the chores together, talk to her and get to know her better.

10. Don't nag! Nagging turns kids off. Sometimes the more you nag them to finish their chores, the more that they won't do it.
11. Set an example. Of course, you must do your chores too. Children are more inclined to help when they see you working around the house.
12. Teach them how to delay gratification. Teach your kids that work comes before playing. This will let your kids know that the sooner they get their chores done, the more time they'll have to play.
13. Give them their own cleaning tools. Smaller sized dusters, brooms, and cleaning cloths will fit easily in your child's hands and she may even start to think of chore time as play time!
14. Give rewards. Prizes for doing chores vary depending on the age and wants or needs of the child. Monetary rewards should be accompanied by lessons on saving.
15. But don't bribe them. Instead, reward him in loving ways. For instance, you can say, "When you finish making your bed, I'll prepare your favorite merienda."
16. Clean together, stay together. Make one day of the week family chore day. It'll be fun to see everyone making a concerted effort to keep the house clean.
